### 13. City of Barrie Council Motion – Illegal Activities

At the November 26, 2018 City of Barrie Council meeting, Barrie City Council made a motion to requesting the Barrie Police Services Board provide recommendation to the City of Barrie to assist in addressing illegal activities within the community.

The motion was focused on Body Rub Parlors in the City. The Barrie Police Service reviewed what other Services and Municipalities across the Province are doing to address this issue and recommended that the City of Barrie develop a By-Law to address the presence of Body Rub Parlours.

If the City decides to move forward with a By-Law the Barrie Police Service would assist in developing it. The Barrie Police Service would participate and support the City as lawfully permitted with the enforcement of the By-Law and the Barrie Police Service would continue to investigate all complaints of Human Trafficking.
